Zoning Report

Road

Lew Staub, Roadmaster, reported that the road crew spent 3 days ditching 3 roads, mowed the yard 3 times, scraped 1 road, graded 8 roads for dust control, and put down 5 loads of dust control. They also dug up the septic tank outside the township garage and had it pumped, checked the roads once, and pushed 3 trees off of roads.

As for equipment, 2 days were spent working on the water pump on the 2017 Massey Ferguson tractor. New battery cables and a thermostat were put on the 2007 JCB backhoe and the 2019 JCB backhoe was hauled to Stephenson Equipment by Tom Wencil.

Old Business

Clean-Up Weekend – Saturday, June 7, 2025 & Sunday, June 8, 2025

Chrissie Kurelowech reminded those in attendance that Clean-Up Weekend will take place on Saturday, June 7, 2025 and Sunday, June 8, 2025. Virgile Iron & Steel will provide six 30-yard dumpsters for \$4,000.00. As in previous years, Harley Richards will be handling scrap.

2A Limestone – Emergency Purchase

During the regular monthly meeting held on Monday, May 12, 2025, the Supervisors questioned whether they would be able to purchase 2A Limestone to be tailgated on Cherrytree-Plum Line Road later in the year, if the road deteriorated to the point where it had to be repaired in an emergency situation. Since the township rejected Item #2 (2A Limestone – Tailgate Delivery, 1,400 tons) on a Request For Quote (RFQ) that was reviewed on Monday, May 12, 2025, the Supervisors questioned whether they would be able to fix the road, in an emergency situation, without putting out another RFQ for stone. Typically, the township only puts out one RFQ for stone per year. Chrissie Kurelowech reported that she asked Buddy Miller, PennDOT Municipal Services Representative, if the township would be able to have 2A Limestone tailgated along the road, if the entire road gave way later in the year, and he said that, for an emergency fix, the cost to repair would probably be under the bidding threshold, so there would be no problem with purchasing it. However, he also said, in the event that the cost of the materials needed to repair the road exceeded the bidding threshold, the township would need to discuss with PennDOT before making the purchase and PennDOT would address the issue if and when it happens.

New Business
